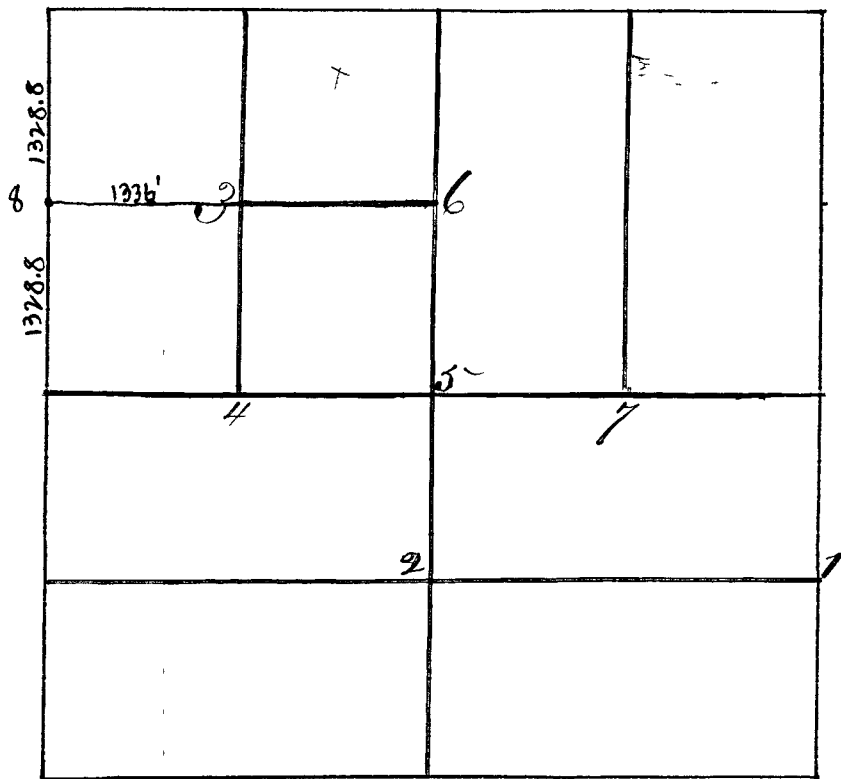


Surveyed by Thomas B. Robertson, Surveyor of Clay County Indiana, April the 2nd and 3rd A. D. 1885 after ten days notice being given to the owner of record and Charles Herbert Senior
 Again the same was sworn as in law requires
 A corner set from 1 to 7 witnesses taken at one of the lines



Corner

- N^o 1. Middle of the East line S.E. corner, a stone - witnesses taken.
 " 2 Center of the South line a sand stone, from which a Bur Oak 4 in. N 35° E 34 L
 and an Elm hollow 17 in. S 2° E 11 1/2 Links
 " 3 Center N.W. quarter a big marked T (N^o bearing).
 " 4 Middle of the South line of the N.W. quarter a big marked T witnesses
 " 5. Center of the Section, a Blue Sand Stone, with a small
 red Acorn head in it, from which a Gum tree S 25° E 68 Links
 and Bur Oak (two together) S 18° E 99 L¹ 1/2
 " 6. Middle of the North line a Blue Flint with broken glass in
 the corner stone, from which a Oak 2 in. N 15° W 31 L¹ 1/2
 and a 1/2 in. Oak 24 in. N 11 1/2° E 188 L¹ 1/2
 Cor No 7 Bur Oak 18 in. 40 1/2° E 21 1/4 L¹ 1/2 Elm 24 in. S 40 1/2° E 40 1/2 L¹ 1/2
 " 7. Middle North line S.E. corner, a Flint Rock 11 x 7 in
 from which a Oak 18 in. S 17 1/4° E 40 1/2 Links
 and an Elm 17 in. in dia. 15 3/4 L¹ 1/2 60 Links

Corner No 7 reset by L. H. Kinn, S.C.C. Dec 20, 1900 after
 three weeks publication in Clay City Democrat. Chain & flagman
 sworn as law directs
